

Woven Eyelet Scarf

This crochet scarf is so easy to make and the woven stitch creates a lovely textured fabric. You can make this scarf as long as you want to. 100g of yarn will make a short neck scarf and 200g of yarn will make an extra long scarf.

You will need:

5mm crochet hook
100-200g Babylonglegs Radiance Aran Yarn

Please note! This pattern uses UK crochet terms. 1dc = 1sc US, 1tr = 1dc US.

Foundation Row: Make 25 chains

Row 1: Dc into 3rd chain from hook. *1ch, skip 1ch, 1dc. Repeat from * to end. 2ch, turn.

Row 2: *Dc into 1ch space, 1ch. Repeat from * to end. Dc into 2ch space made at the start of the previous row. 2ch, turn.

Rows 3-5: as row 2.

Row 6: (Eyelet Row) 1ch, *Tr into 1ch space, 1ch. Repeat from * to end. Tr into 2ch space made at the start of the previous row. 2ch, turn.

Rows 7-9: as row 2.

Row 10: as row 6.

Rows 11-13: as row 2.

Row 14: as row 6.

Repeat row 2 until you have 15g of yarn left or the scarf is 5" shorter than the desired length. Complete the scarf with the same eyelet pattern as before, only in reverse:



Row 6 once.
Row 2 three times.
Row 6 once.
Row 2 three times.
Row 6 once.
Row 2 five times.

Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Handwash and block the scarf. The nature of the stitch means that it will grow in length. As a rough guide:

100g of yarn will create a 50" scarf.
150g of yarn will create a 75" scarf.
200g of yarn will create a 100" scarf.
